WHEREAS: your participation in Earth Day events such as the trash and litter collection event on the Razorback Greenway trail network will help create a brighter future for ourselves and our children,


NOW THEREFORE, I, Lioneld Jordan, Mayor of the City of Fayetteville, Arkansas do hereby proclaim April 22, 2017 as
