Proclamation




- WHEREAS:** National days of prayer have been part of our country's heritage since the first one was declared by the Continental Congress in 1775, and

"National Day of Prayer"


in Fayetteville, Arkansas and call upon our citizens to observe this day in heartfelt prayers for unity and in giving thanks for our many blessings.
